



FAQ's (IN PROGRESS)

The Parks and Recreation Division is responsible for the operations, programming and supervision of 12 city facilities. The division provides quality programs, which include after school clubs and nutritional awareness & physical enhancement programs that positively impact the health and wellness of children and families throughout the community. The division also coordinates 6th, 7th & 8th Grade Dances, which provide teens the opportunity to socialize and interact in a positive, fun, safe and well supervised environment. In addition, the division schedules recreational experiences for children and teens by offering field trips throughout the year.

The programming at seven of our neighborhood parks and playground site. Arceo Park, Cogswell School, Baldwin Mini Park, Fletcher Park, Lambert Park, Mt. View Park and Zamora Park continue to be welcomed assets as we strive to improve the overall quality of life for our children and families. The parks and facilities are under the supervision of our recreation staff that maintain the operations and programming at the sites. The sites provided spaces for children to play and learn, to be safe and secure, and to create and imagine.

The Parks and Recreation Division is responsible for the Adult Sports Program which is a self-sustaining program and offers a variety of organized sports activities for adults. There are many benefits to the city including: facilities are kept in top condition, adults who are normally difficult to program for have good quality programs in which to participate, and local industry and sponsors are able to offer their employees a coordinated recreation program.

The Parks and Recreation Division is responsible for providing special events that continue to promote and build a sense of community and increase cultural unity throughout the city. The division also provides support services to numerous citywide events.

The division also facilitates the use/rental of the El Monte Community Center in addition to all park sites. Numerous schools, community organizations, county agencies and non-profit organizations as well as residents use City facilities.




• Integrated Care Management

- Assist dependent adults and seniors to remain in their homes.
- Provide advocacy and referrals to agencies to foster independence.

• Health & Wellness Initiative

- Supports the development of healthy, active environments for all community residents and includes a Health and Wellness Element.



Community and Senior Services Programs



- **Homelessness Prevention & Rapid Re-housing Program (HPRP)**
(funded through the ARRA (stimulus recovery, administered by HUD))
- Assist El Monte residents out of homelessness and into stable housing for up to 18 months.
- Financial assistance is provided in the form of security deposits and rental and utility payments.
- Case management services are provided to all clients receiving financial assistance to monitor and promote self-sustainability.



Community and Senior Services Programs



•Nutrition

- Provides nutritionally balanced hot meals and nutrition education classes provided by a registered dietitian.



•Summer Food Program

- Provides free breakfast and lunches during the Summer months at 9 park and school sites.
- An average of 105,000 meals are served on a yearly basis.

- Fee based and free organized recreational activities.

- **Contract Classes**

Conducting Business in El Monte

If you are planning to conduct business in the City of El Monte you must obtain a business license.

All contractors, consultants, and sub-contractors are required to obtain a business license; and, may be required to obtain additional permits. Businesses that aren't physically located within the city limits may also be required to obtain a City of El Monte business license.

A business license is also required for rental property owners (5+ units) and several other types of activities, including special events.

If you are [starting a new business](#), you may be required to record a [Fictitious Business Name](#) and/or obtain a [Seller's Permit](#).

Depending on the type of business you conduct, you may be required to interact with more than one City department to acquire a business license. For example, your business facility may require City water services, zoning, environmental or building code approval, or the services you provide may require special permit.
